REGISTRATION DEADLINE: June 25, 2010.

Exhibitor tags will be mailed in July to the name and address on the online entry or registration form.

Receive one (1) FREE admission ticket if you enter 10 or more items (all departments combined).



ADULT ENTRY FEES = \$1.00 per entry

(Maximum fee for any adult exhibitor = \$15 IF you mail in a PAPER Registration Form. If you register online, EVERY entry will be charged \$1.00 with no upper limit.)

CHECK-IN: Saturday, July 24, 2010

Exhibits will be checked in on Saturday, July 24, 2010, between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Check-in procedures will be sent with exhibitor tags in July. Exhibitor tags must be completely filled out and securely attached to exhibits before arriving at the Fairgrounds.

CHECK-OUT: Monday, August 9, 2010

Exhibits will be checked out after the Fair on Monday, August 9, 2010, between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. **No exhibit will be released at any other time.** A claim check (bottom of exhibitor tag), completely filled out, is required to check out each exhibit.

Any exhibit not claimed by August 13 will be considered abandoned and will become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair to be disposed of as necessary.

REGULATIONS:

- 1 All entries are governed by the Family Living Rules and the rules for this department.
- 2 **DEFINITION:** An "antique" is at least 50 years old.
- 3 *Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit in a class. An exhibit is one item, NOT a poster board with several attached items.*
- 4 Maximum size is 2'x3'. Exhibits requiring special display space **MUST** be arranged with Exhibits Office before registration. Acceptance depends on space available.
- 5 When more than one item is required to complete an exhibit (a salt and pepper set, a pair of earrings, etc.), items should be securely attached to a display board or base whenever possible. (Maximum size 2'x3'.) If items can't be attached to a base, each item **MUST** be labeled with exhibitor number and class number.
- 6 Prize money will be paid to the number of places indicated for each class, if quality merits. Judges may occasionally award ribbons for additional placings, but no money will be paid for additional ribbons.
- 7 The exhibitor and the public are prohibited from touching or handling exhibits in any manner or from helping remove exhibits on release day.
- 8 Exhibit building will not be open to the public during judging.
- 9 In order to have this exhibit of as high quality as possible, the right is reserved to reject all unsuitable exhibits, to determine that all rules and regulations have been followed and that no identification of the exhibitor in any

- 10 We want everyone to see your antiques clearly. Small blue, red and white ribbons may be used since large ribbons hide too much of the exhibits. A blue ribbon is first place regardless of the size of the ribbon. If you wish to trade for larger ribbons for your permanent collection, please contact the Exhibits Office after the Fair.

DIVISION 701 - SPECIAL CONTESTS

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

ROCK, ROLL AND RIDE!

Class 1 - Any antique relating to **ROCK AND ROLL**. One item. May be decorative or functional. Examples: antique record album cover, rock and roll concert poster, etc.

Class 2 - Any antique relating to transportation **RIDES**. One item. May be decorative or functional. Examples: antique train schedule, magazine car ad, buggy seat, etc.

DIVISION 702 - MISSOURI HERITAGE ANTIQUES

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Celebrate Missouri's rich heritage! Antiques in this division must be clearly marked "Missouri" or a Missouri town, county, etc. Examples: postcard of Springfield landmarks, a milk bottle from a Missouri dairy, metal sign advertising area businesses, newspaper of historic Missouri event, etc.

Class

- 1 Paper Springfield antique
- 2 Metal Springfield antique
- 3 Any other Springfield antique - wood, glass, pottery, cloth, etc.
- 4 Paper Missouri antique, not Springfield
- 5 Metal Missouri antique, not Springfield
- 6 Any other Missouri antique - wood, glass, pottery, cloth, etc. - not Springfield

DIVISION 703 - GLASS, CHINA, POTTERY ANTIQUES

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$2.50 - \$2 - \$1

Class

- 1 Glass, cut
- 2 **NEW!** Glass, etched
- 3 Glass, colored
- 4 Glass, clear
- 5 Glass, bottle - any color (includes canning jars)
- 6 Glass, any other

Class

- 7 China, hand-painted
- 8 China, cup and saucer
- 9 China, pitcher
- 10 China, any other
- 11 Pottery, any item

DIVISION 704 - METAL, WOOD ANTIQUES

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$2.50 - \$2 - \$1

Class

- 1 Brass, any item
- 2 Granite or tin, any item
- 3 Sterling Silver, any item (not just silver-colored metal)
- 4 Metal, any other small item

Class

- 5 Wood, small container
- 6 Wood, small chair or stool
- 7 Wood, any other small item

DIVISION 705 - PERSONAL ANTIQUES

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$2.50 - \$2 - \$1

Class

- 1 Clothes, adult
- 2 Clothes, baby or child
- 3 Eyeglasses
- 4 Fan

Class

- 5 Jewelry
- 6 Purse, handbag, satchel, briefcase, etc.
- 7 Adult accessory, not listed elsewhere (hat, gloves, etc.)
- 8 Baby/child accessory, not listed elsewhere

DIVISION 706 - HOUSEHOLD ANTIQUES

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$2.50 - \$2 - \$1

Class

- 1 Basket
- 2 Cleaning item - carpet beater, ironing board, scrub board, etc.
- 3 Electric item, small - lamp, clock, radio, etc.
- 4 Kitchen item - cookie cutter, rolling pin, bottle opener, etc. (Dishes and silverware: see Divisions 703 and 704)
- 5 Sewing item - thimble, dress pattern, card of buttons, etc.
- 6 Textiles with handwork - pillow slip, dresser scarf, etc. (Antique quilts - see Home Arts Department. Antique clothes - see Division 705 above.)
- 7 Any other small antique for household use

DIVISION 707 - OTHER ANTIQUES

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$2.50 - \$2 - \$1

Class

- 1 Advertising item - advertising a product or a specific business - yardstick or calendar with a business name, poster advertising a movie, metal fence sign advertising seed, etc.
- 2 Book, hard cover
- 3 Hand tool, not kitchen
- 4 Music item - banjo, sheet music, record cover, hymnal, etc
- 5 Patriotic item
- 6 Photograph or tintype
- 7 Printed paper item (magazine, pamphlet, etc.), not hard cover
- 8 Toy
- 9 Any other small antique not listed

DIVISION 708 - ANTIQUE COLLECTIONS

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$5 - \$4 - \$3

Additional information:

- a. Not less than 5 or more than 15 items per collection.
- b. Must be securely attached to a display board or base (see regulation 5).
- c. Maximum size of display 2'x3'.

Class

- 1 Collection of like items - examples: collection of hat pins, collection of pocket watches, collection of cups, etc.
- 2 **NEW!** Signs of the Time - collection of antiques related by era - examples: early 1900's Grandpa's Dresser (glasses, pocket watch, handkerchief, high collar, etc.); 1940's kitchen (tablecloth, war ration book, Fiesta bowl, etc.). Any decade before 1960 - must identify era on exhibitor tag.
