(Maximum fee for any youth exhibitor = \$10 IF you mail in a PAPER Registration Form. If you register online, EVERY entry will be charged \$0.50 with no upper limit.)

CHECK-IN: Saturday, July 24, 2010

Exhibits will be checked in at the Youth Department between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Saturday, July 24, 2010. Check-in procedures will be sent with exhibitor tags in July. Exhibitor tags must be securely attached to exhibits before arriving at the Fairgrounds.

CHECK-OUT: Monday, August 9, 2010

Exhibits will be checked out after the Fair on Monday, August 9, 2010 between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. **No exhibit will be released at any other time.** A claim check (bottom of exhibitor tag) is required to check out each exhibit.

Any exhibit not claimed by August 13 will be considered abandoned and will become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair to be disposed of as necessary.

REGULATIONS:

1. All entries are governed by the Family Living Rules and Regulations and the rules for this department.
2. Camp Fire USA members who are registered and in good standing may compete.
3. Every exhibit must be the work of the youth exhibitor.
4. **Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit in each class.**
5. Exhibits must have been completed since the 2009 Fair.
6. **Posters and displays may be no more than 22"x28"**, unless otherwise stated in the class. When more than one item is necessary to complete an exhibit, pieces **MUST** be secured to a base so there are **NO LOOSE PIECES**.
7. Exhibit building will not be open to the public during judging.
8. The exhibitor and the public are prohibited from touching or handling exhibits in any manner.
9. Perishable exhibits that become unsightly shall be removed by the superintendent.
10. Prize money will be paid to the number of places indicated for each class, if quality merits. Judges may occasionally award ribbons for additional placings, but no prize money will be paid for additional ribbons.

11. Non-winning exhibits will receive participation ribbons.
12. In order to have this exhibit of as high quality as possible, the right is reserved to reject all unsuitable exhibits, to determine that all rules and regulations have been followed, and that no identification of the exhibitor in any form is displayed during judging.
13. You worked hard on your entry, and we want everyone to see your work clearly. Small blue, red and white ribbons may be used since large ribbons hide too much of the exhibits. A blue ribbon is first place regardless of the size of the ribbon. If you wish to trade for larger ribbons for your permanent collection, please contact the Exhibits Office after the Fair.
