(Maximum fee for any adult exhibitor = \$15 IF you mail in a PAPER Registration Form. If you register online, EVERY entry will be charged \$1.00 with no upper limit.)

CHECK-IN: Saturday, July 24, 2010

Exhibits will be checked in on Saturday, July 24, 2010, between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Check-in procedure will be sent with exhibitor tags in July. Exhibitor tags must be securely attached to exhibits before arriving at the Fairgrounds.

CHECK-OUT: Monday, August 9, 2010.

Exhibits will be checked out after the Fair on Monday, August 9, 2010, between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. **No exhibit will be released at any other time.** A claim check (bottom of exhibitor tag) is required to check out each exhibit.

Any exhibit not claimed by August 13 will be considered abandoned and will become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair to be disposed of as necessary.

REGULATIONS:

1. All entries are governed by the Family Living Rules and Regulations and the rules for this department.
2. Adult exhibitors only (19 years and over). Youth work, see Youth Department.
3. **NUMBER OF EXHIBITS:** Exhibitor is limited to **ONE (1)** exhibit in a class.
4. Exhibits must be the original work of the exhibitor, done within the past two years and not previously shown in any class at the Ozark Empire Fair. No copies will be accepted.
5. Exhibitor tags should be attached to exhibits with string (whenever possible) so that the tag is clearly visible.
6. Prize money will be paid to the number of places indicated for each class, if quality merits. Judges may occasionally award additional places but no prize money will be paid for these additional ribbons.
7. The exhibitor and the public are prohibited from touching or handling exhibits in any manner or from helping remove exhibits on release day.
8. Exhibit building will not be open to the public during judging.
9. In order to have this exhibit of as high quality as possible, the right is reserved to reject all unsuitable exhibits, to determine that all rules and regulations have been followed and that no identification of the exhibitor in any form is displayed during judging.

10. You worked hard on your entry, and we want everyone to see your work clearly. Small blue, red and white ribbons may be used since large ribbons hide too much of the exhibits. A blue ribbon is first place regardless of the size of the ribbon. If you wish to trade for larger ribbons for your permanent collection, please contact the Exhibits Office after the Fair.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR ARTWORK:

- a. **Professionals** are those who are employed as artists or teachers of art, who have a degree in art, or who consistently sell their work. **Non-professionals** are those who have art as a hobby and make only an occasional sale.
- b. **Maximum size** of exhibit is 36" x 36", NOT including frame. Any piece (including mixed media) that is too heavy to hang (in the opinion of fair staff) will not be judged.
- c. Exhibits **MUST** be original. Artwork copied totally or in great part from instruction book, instructor's work or any other artwork or published photograph (other than the exhibitor's) will not be accepted.
- d. All work **MUST BE FRAMED** (exception: wrapped canvas). All paint and artwork finishes must be dry.
- e. Artwork **MUST HAVE HOOK EYES AND WIRE ATTACHED READY TO HANG. ANY HANGING WORK SUBMITTED WITHOUT HOOK EYES AND WIRE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
- f. **TAGS:** Exhibitor tag must be securely attached with string so tag hangs over front of upper left corner.
- g. Abstract contains real-life subjects which are distorted or abstracted so they are not immediately recognizable. Non-subjective has no subject other than color, line and/or forms. Surreal works depict objects that look real but are placed in impossible or implausible situations.
- h. **FIGURATIVE** is defined as human or animal figures (including busts) as the main focus or center of attention. A landscape with a deer in it would not be figurative.

DIVISION 801 - PROFESSIONAL ARTWORK

Best of Show: \$60

NATIONAL ART SHOP, 509 S. National, has contributed \$25 toward Best of Show.

Prize money:

Classes 1-8: \$60 - \$40 - \$30

Classes 9-11: \$25 - \$20 - \$15

Note: Classes 1-9 are two-dimensional artwork **ONLY**, on canvas, paper, masonite, etc.

Class:

- 1 **Rock, Roll and Ride** - Painting, drawing or sculpture related to a ride (transportation). May be past, present, or future transportation. Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit in this class. Examples: painting of a pickup truck, drawing of a steam train, sculpture of a hot air balloon, etc.
- 2 Watercolor - figurative (see "h" above)
- 3 Watercolor - non-figurative
- 4 Oil or acrylic painting - realistic, figurative (see "h" above)
- 5 Oil or acrylic painting - realistic, non-figurative
- 6 Oil or acrylic painting - abstract, non-objective, surreal
- 7 Drawing (any media, including pastel) or print (including batik)
- 8 Miniature painting or drawing, any subject, any media. Maximum size 8"x8", NOT including frame.
- 9 Mixed media, collage (two-dimensional)
- 10 Pottery - handmade
- 11 Sculpture and three-dimensional assemblages (NO dolls. Enter dolls in Hobby Crafts Department.)



DIVISION 802 - NON-PROFESSIONAL ARTWORK

NATIONAL ART SHOP, 509 S. National, will award \$25 to Best of Show.

Prize money:

Classes 21-30: \$35 - \$25 - \$15

Classes 31-34: \$20 - \$15 - \$10

Note: Classes 21-31 are two-dimensional artwork ONLY, on canvas, paper, masonite, etc.

Class:

- 21 **Rock, Roll and Ride** - Painting, drawing or sculpture related to a ride (transportation). May be past, present, or future transportation. Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit in this class. Examples: painting of a pickup truck, drawing of a steam train, sculpture of a hot air balloon, etc.
- 22 Watercolor - figurative (see "h" above)
- 23 Watercolor - non-figurative
- 24 Oil or acrylic painting - realistic landscape
- 25 Oil or acrylic painting - realistic figurative (see "h" above)
- 26 Oil or acrylic painting - realistic, any subject except landscape or figurative
- 27 Oil or acrylic painting - abstract, non-objective, surreal
- 28 Drawing, pastel or print (including batik) - figurative (see "h" above)
- 29 Drawing, pastel or print (including batik) - non-figurative
- 30 Miniature painting or drawing, any subject, any media. Maximum size 8"x8", NOT including frame.
- 31 Mixed media, collage, (two-dimensional)
- 32 Pottery - wheelthrown piece
- 33 Pottery - handmade piece, slab, coil, etc - NOT molded
- 34 Sculpture and three-dimensional assemblages (NO dolls. Enter dolls in Hobby Crafts Department.)

DIVISION 804 - LEATHER CRAFT, BEGINNER

Best of Show, Beginner: \$5

SPRINGFIELD LEATHER, 1463 S. Glenstone, will award a \$50 gift certificate to sponsor's choice exhibit in Leather Craft, Beginner and Intermediate competing together.

DON EPPERLY MEMORIAL AWARD: The Ozark Mountain Leather Guild will present a free one-year membership to the Guild for any person who has entered a leather craft in any Ozark Empire Fair departments or classes other than Fine Arts Leather Craft. Entry must be comprised of at least 90% leather and win a first place ribbon at the 2008 Ozark Empire Fair. The winner will be drawn from all first place winners, Beginner and Intermediate competing together.

Prize money: Beginner: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS:

- a. Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit per class.
- b. Definitions: **Beginner** competition is open to any adult exhibitor with less than two (2) years experience in leather craft. An exhibitor who has accumulated a total of six (6) blue ribbons as a Beginner, must move up to Intermediate level regardless of years of experience. **Intermediate** competition is open to any adult exhibitor with two (2) or more years experience in leather craft. (Youth leather: see Youth Department.)
- c. Exhibit must be at least 90% leather and cannot show signs of wear or use.
- d. If your piece is made to hold something specific (cigars, paper towels, etc.), you can include that with your exhibit so the piece will be functionally complete. However, if your piece is made to hold something you don't want to bring to the Fair (jewelry, knife, etc.), you can write the intended use on the exhibitor tag and/or attach a photo of the item in actual use.
- e. The exhibitor is responsible for entering the item in the correct category and class. An item entered incorrectly will be accepted for display only and will not be judged.

- 1 Purse, clutch purse, handbag, shoulder bag, fanny pack - any leather work
- 2 Billfold, wallet, checkbook cover, pocket secretary, etc.
- 3 Belt
- 4 Wearing apparel or accessory item (hat band, wrist band, earrings or other jewelry, etc.)
- 5 Carry case (camera, briefcase, etc.) or sporting case (quiver, gun, etc.)
- 6 Pocket item (card case, key case, eyeglass case, or any item which can be carried in a pocket EXCEPT billfold, checkbook cover or any item which has it's own class listed above)
- 7 Miscellaneous, any item not listed (including pictures)

DIVISION 805 - LEATHER CRAFT, INTERMEDIATE

Best of Show, Intermediate: \$15

THE OZARK MOUNTAIN LEATHER GUILD, Springfield, has contributed \$200 toward prize money in Intermediate classes.

SPRINGFIELD LEATHER, 1463 S. Glenstone, will award a \$50 gift certificate to sponsor's choice exhibit in Leather Craft.

DON EPPERLY MEMORIAL AWARD: The Ozark Mountain Leather Guild will present a free one-year membership to the Guild for any person who has entered a leather craft in any Ozark Empire Fair departments or classes other than Fine Arts Leather Craft. Entry must be comprised of at least 90% leather and win a first place ribbon at the 2008 Ozark Empire Fair. The winner will be drawn from all first place winners.

Prize money: Intermediate: \$8 - \$5 - \$3

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS:

- a. Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit per class.
- b. Definitions: **Beginner** competition is open to any adult exhibitor with less than two (2) years experience in leather craft. An exhibitor who has accumulated a total of six (6) blue ribbons as a Beginner, must move up to Intermediate level regardless of years of experience. **Intermediate** competition is open to any adult exhibitor with two (2) or more years experience in leather craft. (Youth leather: see Youth Department.)
- c. Exhibit must be at least 90% leather and cannot show signs of wear or use.
- d. If your piece is made to hold something specific (cigars, paper towels, etc.), you can include that with your exhibit so the piece will be functionally complete. However, if your piece is made to hold something you don't want to bring to the Fair (jewelry, knife, etc.), you can write the intended use on the exhibitor tag and/or attach a photo of the item in actual use.
- e. The exhibitor is responsible for entering the item in the correct category and class. An item entered incorrectly will be accepted for display only and will not be judged.

- 21 Book (book covers, scrapbooks, notebooks, etc.)
- 22 Picture, any style, colored
- 23 Picture, any style, not colored
- 24 Household article, anything normally used in the home or office other than books or pictures. Examples: jewelry box, cigar box, humidior, etc.
- 25 Purse, clutch purse, handbag, shoulder bag, fanny pack - carved or stamped
- 26 Purse, clutch purse, handbag, shoulder bag, fanny pack - other
- 27 Billfold, wallet, checkbook cover, pocket secretary, etc.
- 28 Belt
- 29 Accessory item (hat band, wrist band, earrings or other jewelry, etc.)
- 30 Wearing apparel
- 31 Carrying case (camera, briefcase, etc.) or sporting case (quiver, gun, holster with belt, etc.)
- 32 Horse accessory or gear (saddle, bridle, breast collar, harness, hobbles, whip, reins, saddle bag, etc. Anything to control a horse or anything that can be used with a horse.)
- 33 Miniature saddle and tack
- 34 Pocket item (card case, key case, shear case, eyeglass case, or any item which can be carried in a pocket, EXCEPT billfold, checkbook cover or other item which have separate classes listed above)
- 35 Leather sculpture
- 36 Miscellaneous, any leather item not listed in this division
