REGISTRATION DEADLINE: July 10, 2010

On-line entry is available through our website www.ozarkempirefair.com. On-line entry will require that you enter each specific class. If you don't yet know specific classes, please use the paper registration form.

Registration forms to mail in are available at www.ozarkempirefair.com or at the Ozark Empire Fair office.

Exhibitor tags will be mailed in July to the name and address on the online registration or registration form.

Receive one (1) FREE admission ticket if you enter 10 or more items (all departments combined).

If using paper registration form:

1. Fill out name, address, phone, exhibitor's signature, and "Flowers Department".
2. LIST EACH DIVISION TO BE ENTERED and the estimated number of exhibits IN EACH DIVISION. Individual class numbers are not required. We don't know which admission tickets to send you if you don't list division numbers.

ADULT ENTRY FEES = \$1 per entry

(Maximum fee for any adult exhibitor = \$15 IF you mail in a PAPER Registration Form. If you register online, EVERY entry will be charged \$1.00 with no upper limit.)

CHECK-IN and JUDGING: Check-in procedures will be sent with exhibitor tags in July.

Exhibits will be accepted starting at 6 a.m. on show days.

We cannot accept entries at any other time or any day before show days. Exhibits MUST be in place and ready for judging by 9 a.m. Judging begins at 9:30 a.m.

EXHIBITOR MUST PRESENT OFFICIAL GATE TICKET TO ENTER THE FAIRGROUNDS. Exhibits and/or exhibitor tags will not be accepted as gate admission. Official gate tickets (for shows indicated on registration form) will be mailed with exhibitor tags.

Exhibitor name and address MUST be filled in on both divisions of exhibitor tag. **Please DO NOT tear apart exhibitor tag sections.**

REGULATIONS:

1. All entries are governed by the Family Living Rules and Regulations and the rules for this department.
2. **ALL COMPETITIONS ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.**
3. Flowers grown by youth exhibitors (18 years and under): see Special Events Department.
4. Exhibitor's name and address should be attached to bottom of any container.
5. Each article will be under the control of the superintendent, and every precaution will be taken to prevent loss or damage. But, in no event, will the Fair be responsible for damage or loss that may occur.
6. If a specific regulation is not covered by local rules, rules of National Council of State Garden Clubs will apply.
7. All awards will be given if quality warrants. Decisions of judges are final.
8. You worked hard growing your flowers, and we want everyone to see your work clearly. Small blue, red and white ribbons may be used since large ribbons hide too much of the exhibits. A blue ribbon is first place regardless of the size of the ribbon. If you wish to trade for larger ribbons for your permanent collection, please contact the Exhibits Office after the Fair.

SPECIMEN CLASSES

9. Only one exhibit per family is permitted in any class of potted plants.
10. In some horticulture classes, an exhibitor may make more than one entry per class, provided each is a different variety. Check individual division instructions. **VARIETY MUST BE LISTED ON EXHIBITOR TAG.**
11. Horticulture classes will NOT be sub-divided unless specifically listed as such in division rules.
12. Flowers, plants and foliage shown must have been grown by exhibitor. Must be garden grown except for potted plants.
13. All specimens must be pest and disease free.
14. Proper genus-species name should be listed on tag.
15. All specimens are to be exhibited in suitable clear containers provided by exhibitor, unless otherwise indicated in division rules. Exhibitors should plan enough time to fill containers with water in addition to displaying specimens.
16. All specimens should be **shown with foliage as grown**. No leaves should be below water line unless otherwise noted.
17. All hanging baskets and potted plants must have been in possession of exhibitor for at least three (3) months.
18. Every effort will be made to display potted plants on tables. However, if number of entries is larger than can be displayed on tables, some potted plants may be displayed on the floor.

DESIGN CLASSES

19. **All designs will be Bench, staged on tables.**
20. Designs must be the work of exhibitor.
21. **Display tables will be marked for four (4) designs per class, first come - first served.** If additional designers have entries, space will be assigned wherever available.
22. No artificial foliage or flowers permitted.
23. Plant materials **DO NOT HAVE TO BE GROWN BY EXHIBITOR**, but **MUST** be locally garden grown. Unless otherwise stated, line material for fresh flower designs can be dried and/or fresh.

24. Appropriate accessories may be used in any class. However, emphasis will be on plant material.
25. All accessories used are the responsibility of the exhibitor.
26. Frames, backgrounds and niches may be used in any design.
27. **All designs will be staged on tables.** No arrangement shall exceed 30" in width unless otherwise specified. There is no height limit on bench designs. If a background is used, design **MUST** stay within the background.
28. Small and mini designs may be bench or tabletop mini-pedestal (provided by exhibitor).

- a. All roses and designs must be in place and ready for judging by 9 a.m. Late entries will not be accepted. **Exhibitors should plan enough time to fill containers with water in addition to arranging roses.** Judging begins at 9:30 a.m.
- b. If there are 8 or more entries in a class (example: Class 4 Hybrid Tea Roses), the class may be divided by color.

Fewer than 8 entries in a class, the class will be judged together and awarded one 1st, one 2nd, and one 3rd as quality merits.

- c. Only one exhibit of the same variety is permitted from an exhibitor or a household. Family members may enter as a team. Entries must be grown in the exhibitor's outdoor, private garden.
- d. Wedging material is permitted to position a specimen (individual or spray) in its container. Aluminum foil or styrofoam is recommended.
