Exhibits in this department will be checked in **Wednesday, July 28, 2010** between 8 a.m. - 6 p.m. Check-in procedures will be sent with exhibitor tags in July. Exhibitor tags must be securely attached to exhibits before arriving at the Fairgrounds.

**CHECK-OUT:** Monday, August 9, 2010

Exhibits in this department will be checked out after the Fair on **Monday, August 9, 2010**, between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. A claim check (bottom of exhibitor tag), completely filled out, is required to check out each exhibit. Perishable food and disposable containers will already have been discarded. Any other exhibit or container not picked up by 6 p.m. will be disposed of.

**No exhibit will be released at any other time.**

## **REGULATIONS:**

1. All entries are governed by the Family Living Rules and Regulations and the rules for this department.
2. **Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit in a class.**
3. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and made from scratch (unless otherwise specified).
4. Adults only. Youth Foods: see Youth Department.
5. If you are required to submit a recipe with your entry (see individual division rules), the recipe should be typed on **8½"x11" paper**. Exhibitor number and class number must be included on recipe.
6. Exhibitor tag for baked goods must be attached to container or plate, NOT to wrapper. Unless otherwise specified, **exhibit should be on a sturdy disposable white foam or heavy paper plate** or cardboard base.
7. Superintendent will have authority to remove and dispose of foods that become unsightly.
8. Prize money will be paid to the number of places indicated for each class, if quality merits. Judges may award additional placings but no money will be paid for these additional ribbons.
9. Exhibitor and the public are prohibited from touching or handling exhibits in any manner.

A blue ribbon is first place regardless of the size of the ribbon. If you wish to trade for larger ribbons for your permanent collection, please contact the Exhibits Office after the Fair.

**Champion: Ribbon**

Prize money: \$4 - \$3 - \$2

**Additional information:**

- a. Unless otherwise indicated in class description, it is the exhibitor's choice
  1. to exhibit whole or half cake.
  2. to exhibit layer, sheet, tube or bundt cake, as most appropriate for the type of cake.
  3. to frost, ice or glaze any cake.

- b. All cakes must be made from scratch. Mix Tricks cakes (from box mixes), see Division 1009.
- c. If you are required to submit a recipe (see class descriptions), the recipe should be typed on **8½"x11" paper**. Exhibitor number and class number must be included on recipe.
- d. Recipes become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair and may be used in future publications or promotions.
- e. **ADDITIONAL CAKE CLASSES:** See Divisions 1004, 1009, and in the **Special Events Department**.

**DIVISION 1002 - COOKIES**

**CHEF LANA MERRICK**, Columbia, MO, will award \$20 to Champion.

Prize money: \$3 - \$2.50 - \$2

**Additional information:**

- a. Cookies must be made from scratch. (Box mixes see Division 1009.)
- b. Exhibit to consist of four (4) cookies on a sturdy disposable white foam plate.
- c. Exhibit must be accompanied by the recipe typed on **8½"x11" paper**.
- d. **Please use 6"-7" sturdy paper plates.** Exhibitor tag and recipe page must be attached to plate.
- e. Cookies will be disqualified if rules are not met (number of cookies, recipe, etc.)
- f. **ADDITIONAL COOKIE CLASSES:** Divisions 1004, 1007, 1009 and **Special Events Department**.
- g. Recipes become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair and may be used in future publications or promotions.

### **HAMMONS PRODUCTS BLACK WALNUT BAKING CONTEST**

HAMMONS PRODUCTS COMPANY, Stockton, will award the following prize money in each class: 1st - \$50; 2nd - \$30; 3rd - \$20.



#### **Special Regulations:**

- a. Black walnut "baking" includes cake, cookies and muffins. Using black walnuts in salads, side dishes or main dishes: see Black Walnut Cooking in the **Special Events Department**.
- b. Each recipe must use at least ¼ cup American Black Walnuts.
- c. Each exhibit must be accompanied by the recipe typed on 8½"x11" **paper**. All recipes become the property of Hammons Products Company and the Ozark Empire Fair. The exhibitor, by entering, allows Hammons Products Company or the Ozark Empire Fair to use the recipe in future publications and promotions.

#### **Class**

- 1 American Black Walnut Cake: Exhibitor's choice to exhibit whole or half cake
- 2 American Black Walnut Cookies: 6 cookies

## DIVISION 1005 - DECORATED CAKES

**JUNE'S CAKERY**, 2545 E. Division, will award a trophy to Grand Champion in memory of June Buchanan. **JUNE'S CAKERY** will also award \$3 to Champion in amateur classes and a trophy to Champion in professional classes.

Prize money:

Amateur: \$5 - \$3 - \$2

Professional: \$6 - \$4 - \$3

### Additional information:

- a. Definitions: **Amateur:** Those who have cake decorating as a hobby and only occasionally make a sale. **Professional:** Those who are teachers of cake decorating or consistently sell their work.
- b. **All cakes in this division must be decorated before arriving at Fairgrounds.** Set-up and minor final decoration allowed on tiered cakes.
- c. Decorated cakes may be made of cardboard mold or combination of cake and cardboard. Cakes will not be cut.
- d. Maximum SIZE, including decorations: 32" high, 30" wide, 20" front to back.
- e. Foreign techniques decorations minimal on all cakes except classes specifically for foreign techniques (classes 3 and 13). **Foreign techniques:** Lambeth, Rolled Fondant, South African, Nirvana, Australian, Gum Paste, etc.

## DIVISION 1006 - HONEY

**Champion: \$20**

Prize money: \$14 - \$12 - \$10

**BEEKEEPERS ASSOCIATION OF THE OZARKS**, Springfield, has contributed \$75 toward Champion and prize money.

**HOWARD WIMMER**, Springfield, has contributed \$25 toward prize money.

**JOE SNAVELY MEMORIAL AWARD:** Ann and Bruce Snavely have contributed \$40 toward prize money, in memory of Joe Snavely.

### Additional information:

- a. Only one (1) exhibit per class is permitted from an apiary.
- b. Honey must be produced by exhibitor's bees.
- c. Honey shown this year may not have been shown at the Ozark Empire Fair in any previous year.
- d. Label each jar or box **ON BOTTOM ONLY** with exhibitor NUMBER (no names please) and class number.

- e. Amount required:  
Extracted honey: Exhibit is 3 1-pound queenline jars.  
Cut comb honey exhibit is 3 closed plastic boxes (contents visible from all sides) of 12 oz to 1 pound each.  
Frame comb honey exhibit is 1 frame displayed in a closed container in which both sides of the comb can be clearly seen.  
Chunk comb honey exhibit is 3 2-pound jars. Beeswax: Exhibit is 1 piece with total weight 1-2 pounds.

### **DIVISION 1007 - HONEY BAKING**

**Champion: \$3**

Prize money: \$3 - \$2.50 - \$2

**WADE BEE FARM**, Bolivar, has contributed \$25 toward Champion and prize money.

**Additional information:**

- a. Exhibits in Honey Baking **MUST** be accompanied by the recipe typed on **8½"x11" paper**.
- b. Recipes become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair and may be used in future publications or promotions.
- c. Exhibits may contain some sugar. Preference will be given to exhibits containing the least amount of sugar, all other things being equal.

**Class**

- 1 Honey cookies (4)
- 2 Honey quick bread (5 muffins, ½ fruit/nut loaf, etc.)
- 3 Honey yeast bread (½ loaf, 3 rolls, etc.)

### **DIVISION 1008 - YEAST BREADS**

**Champion (Classes 1-12): Ribbon**

Prize money:

Classes 1-11: \$3 - \$2.50 - \$2

Class 12: \$6 - \$5 - \$4

**Additional information:**

- a. Yeast breads must be made from scratch. No bread machines. (Frozen bread dough mix tricks, see Division 1009.)
- b. **ADDITIONAL YEAST BREAD CLASSES**: Division 1007, 1009, and contests in the **Special Events Department**.

### Class

- 1 White loaf, ½ loaf
- 2 Whole wheat or graham loaf, ½ loaf
- 3 Rye loaf, ½ loaf
- 4 Herb bread (specify herbs), ½ loaf
- 5 Yeast bread containing fruit and/or vegetables (raisin bread, onion bread, etc.), ½ loaf
- 6 Other yeast loaf (specify), ½ loaf
- 7 White rolls, any shape, 3
- 8 Whole wheat rolls, any shape, 3
- 9 Other yeast rolls (potato rolls, etc.), specify type, 3
- 10 Cinnamon rolls, 3
- 11 Any other yeast bread product (English muffins, bagels, etc.), ½ loaf or 3 bagels, etc.
- 12 Bread Basket: Collection of yeast breads displayed in a basket. MUST include at least two (2) different kinds of dough and at least three (3) different shapes (loaf, pan rolls, cloverleaf rolls, etc.) A loaf should be exhibited as ½ loaf. An exhibit of rolls is three (3) rolls of one variety. Judging will include attractiveness of display.

### **DIVISION 1009 - MIX TRICKS**

**Champion: Ribbon**

Prize money: \$3 - \$2.50 - \$2

#### **Additional information:**

- a. Baked goods created with a commercial mix as the base BUT must have **significant alterations** by the exhibitor.
- b. Exhibit must be accompanied by the recipe typed on **8½"x11" paper**. Exhibitor number and class number must be included on recipe.
- c. Number of items per entry: cakes - exhibitor's choice to enter whole or half cake; loaf breads - ½ loaf; cookies - 4; muffins - 5.
- d. Recipes become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair and may be used in future publications or promotions.

- 1 Cake mix
- 2 Cookie mix
- 3 Muffin or quick bread mix
- 4 Frozen bread dough

### **DIVISION 1010 - CHALLENGED ADULTS**

**Champion: Ribbon**

Prize money: \$3 - \$2.50 - \$2

#### **Additional information:**

- a. Competition in Division 1010 is open to adults who are challenged physically, mentally or developmentally.
- b. Regular Foods Department rules apply.
- c. Exhibitor **CANNOT** enter the same type item in this division and any other division. Example: if you enter chocolate chip cookies in this division, you can't enter chocolate chip cookies in Cookies Division.
- d. On exhibitor tag, write whether you made your item from a mix or from scratch (without mix).

- 1 Chocolate chip cookies, 4
- 2 Other cookies, 4
- 3 Cupcakes, iced, 3
- 4 Candy, 4 pieces
- 5 Decorated cookies, 4
- 6 Jelly or jam, 1 pint or half-pint jar, specify type
