# BEEF

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Exhibitors entering open classes in this division should familiarize themselves with the General Rules and Regulations and Livestock Entry Rules of the Ozark Empire Fair before completing entry forms.
2. Exhibitors entering 4-H/FFA classes should familiarize themselves with District 4-H and FFA Rules, General Rules and Livestock Entry Rules before completing entry.
3. Entry forms are available at [www.ozarkempirefair.com](http://www.ozarkempirefair.com) or at the Ozark Empire Fair Office. Entry forms may be photocopied. Enter online at [www.ozarkempirefair.com](http://www.ozarkempirefair.com).
4. Each animal must have correct registration papers, health papers, tattoos and/or identifying marks recognized by respective breed associations. These will be checked against the information given on the entry form.
5. **SEE SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS IN LIVESTOCK ENTRY RULES.**
6. Entries close **June 15** and those mailed must be postmarked no later than midnight of this date. Late entries may be accepted through June 25. Entries postmarked after midnight June 15 and through midnight June 25 must be accompanied by the penalty fee of \$25.00 per head in addition to regular fees.
7. Stalls and location in the barns will be designated only by the division superintendent. **Cow/Calf entries must purchase two (2) stalls.**
8. Animals shall be brought to the barns by 9 a.m. each day and remain in the barns, except when showing, until tie-out time at 7 p.m. Tie-out space (three feet) per head is provided. No tie-outs permitted in the trailer area.

**GROOMING CHUTES:** Exhibitors may pay a \$20 charge for a grooming chute space with their stall assignments. **Please indicate on entry blank if you are paying for a grooming chute space.** Exhibitors who do not choose to pay for a chute space will be allowed to have a grooming chute in the barn or proximity of the barn on show day only. Chutes are to be used only in assigned stalling and make-up areas for beef cattle. Any chutes outside this area are subject to removal and exhibitor will be fined \$25.

**PREMIER EXHIBITOR:** A banner will be awarded to the Premier Exhibitor in each open beef breed, as determined by the following point scale: 1st prize = 3 points; 2nd prize = 2 points; 3rd prize = 1 point. Fitting services are not eligible for Premier Exhibitor Awards. Group classes do not count. Ties will be broken by champions.

Champions and Reserve Champions - Award ONLY

**4-H/FFA:** Use same division numbers as open shows. Use class numbers listed in the left-hand column of each section. **4-H/FFA animals are NOT automatically entered in open shows.** Each animal must be entered into the respective 4-H/FFA and open classes. No refund of entry will be made for 4-H/FFA exhibitors who wish to not participate in the open show.

## 4-H/FFA BEEF SHOWMANSHIP

Two classes will be offered in each breed based on age of youth as of Jan. 1, 2010. Juniors are 13 years and younger; seniors are 14 years and older.

1. No pre-entry is required. No entry fee is required.
2. All participants shall have entered and exhibited in the 2010 Ozark Empire Fair 4-H/FFA beef cattle show. Showmanship participation must be in the breed the exhibitor showed in regular classes.
3. An exhibitor may enter in only one breed.
4. There must be at least two participants in each showmanship class of each breed or classes will be combined and only one award given.
5. There must be at least two participants in each breed or classes will be dropped and no award given.

## 4-H/FFA Bred & Owned Female Awards

The Supreme Female Committee of the Ozark Empire Fair Foundation will provide a cash award to each Bred and Owned Champion during the 2010 Ozark Empire Fair. Champions will be selected at the conclusion of each 4-H/FFA breed show. The Champion Bred and Owned Female will receive \$300 if there are 5 or more bred and owned females competing within that breed; \$200 if there are less than 5 bred and owned females within the breed.

**Bred & Owned:** Exhibitor must be listed as both breeder and owner on the original registration certificate. Original registration certificate must be presented to the breed superintendent upon check-in. **Exhibitor must indicate Bred & Owned on the Entry Form.**

## Earl K. Nau Scholarship

An endowment fund in memory of Earl K. Nau has been established at the Ozark Empire Fair to provide an annual scholarship to a 4-H or FFA exhibitor of beef cattle at the Fair. The Nau Family has provided the initial funding of the scholarship to honor their late father.

Each year at the Fair, young beef exhibitors are encouraged to apply for the scholarship to be awarded at the **next** Fair. Applicants must be at least 15 years of age and have exhibited breeding beef cattle at the Ozark Empire Fair for at least two years. Applicants will achieve scores based on winnings in:

- \* 4-H/FFA beef classes
- \* Showmanship classes
- \* Open beef classes
- \* Herdsmanship awards
- \* Other 4-H/FFA exhibit classes

Applicants will also receive points for participation (and ranking) in district 4-H/FFA livestock judging competition as well as for service at the Fair as a volunteer in either the 4-H or FFA Exhibit Buildings or activities. The period of participation to be evaluated is from the 2009 Ozark Empire Fair through July 15, 2010.

The scholarship winner will receive \$1,500 for tuition, textbooks or other fees associated with the pursuit of a post-secondary education. **Applications must be received (mailed or delivered) in the Fair Office no later than 4 p.m., July 15.** Applications are available at [www.ozarkempirefair.com](http://www.ozarkempirefair.com).

The scholarship will be presented at the Angus Show on Saturday, July 31. Contributions to the **Earl K. Nau Scholarship** are being accepted at this time. All donations are tax deductible and will be applied to the fund balance. It is the desire of the Fair and the Nau's that the fund grow to the point of providing two annual awards. The **OZARK EMPIRE FAIR FOUNDATION** will award \$2,500 to the Supreme Champion 4-H/FFA Female and \$1,500 to the Reserve Supreme Champion 4-H/FFA Female. In addition, third, fourth and fifth place animals will also be selected and awarded \$1,000; \$750 and \$500, respectively. Competition is open to the 4-H/FFA Overall Grand and Overall Reserve Grand Champion Females during the 2010 Ozark Empire Fair. **Fitting Rule:** See Section L (Show Ring Code of Ethics and Conduct) under Livestock Rules found in Administration and General Rules. **Exhibitor Dress:** Western attire consisting of nice jeans and a collard shirt. Only western boots or dark leather shoes allowed. No hats or caps.

### 4-H/FFA Beef Awards Program

A 4-H/FFA Beef Awards program will also be held at this time. Premier Junior Exhibitor Awards, Showmanship and other special awards will be presented.

**Herd Builder Voucher: EVERY 4-H/FFA BREEDING BEEF EXHIBITOR AT THE 2010 FAIR, with exception of anyone who has been awarded a voucher in previous years,** will be eligible to win a \$1,000 Herd Builder Voucher, which will be good toward the purchase of a female, either privately or at auction from any sponsoring breeder. The number of vouchers awarded will depend upon the number of \$150 sponsorships provided by breeders. **4-H/FFA exhibitors must be present at the Championship Drive/Awards Program to win.** Vouchers are valid for 1 year.

**SGBI SUPER POINT SHOW****Rules for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows:**

1. Heifers 24 months of age or older to be eligible must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in embryo transfer program, this must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician.
2. A cow shown with calf at side: Calf must be her natural calf meeting the standard of excellence.
3. All senior bull classes (late junior yearling bull and over) must have either a nose ring or a nose clip for show purposes.
4. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo, numerical firebrand or freeze brand.
5. To be eligible to compete in SGBI-approved junior shows, animal(s) must be recorded in the name of the junior member. This recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered.
6. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. **Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will be dismissed from the arena and/or forfeit prize money, awards and points won.**
7. Each animal must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age.
8. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
9. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals to be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue. Animals will be inspected by Field Service Representative (if present) assisted by one member of Shows and Exhibits Committee or Breed Standards Committee if needed to settle disputes. If no Field Service Representative is present, it will be done by committee members not involved in that class.
10. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
11. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and twenty-five (25) head of cattle, or a minimum of fifty (50) head of cattle to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
12. In all shows in which fifty (50) head or less entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.
13. Classes with over 30 entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
14. The judge must be an SGBI approved judge.
15. Each exhibitor must be a member in good standing with SGBI.
16. Dress for showing in an approved SGBI show shall be of clean and neat clothing. Hats or bareheaded with no caps. This is for both Open and Junior shows. **No** tennis shoes.
17. Juniors showing in open shows is allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. Exception: feed, care, transportation to a show may be allowed. Refer to junior ownership rules.
18. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, or other appearance change for cosmetic purposes, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Silicone injection or other injections for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited.
19. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, owner may be asked to not display his/her cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
20. **ETHICS:** The showing of unethically fitted livestock or livestock of any ineligible age for exhibition in the class entered is prohibited. Unethical fitting will be deemed to consist of any method altering the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body. Animals showing signs of having been operated upon or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults in conformation or with the intent to deceive relative to the animal's soundness, will be disqualified. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal entered by him to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee and agrees that conclusions reached by the Committee shall be final, without recourse against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
21. Any exhibitor, whether it be owner or custom fitter or anyone else who has custody of the animal being shown in any SGBI approved show, who shows an animal which has had an anabolic steroid administered to it either by injection, diuretic or other means, shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of 6 months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. The animal shall be barred from ever showing in an SGBI approved show.
22. No pumping or filling of an animal with liquid, air or any other substance is allowed. Violation will result in disqualification and banning from all shows of that exhibitor and/or owner.
23. Any exhibitor who knowingly shows an animal in an SGBI approved show in violation of rules wherein above set forth relating to showing an animal in its natural conformation and structure as defined herein above may be suspended by the Board of Directors for 6 months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and for life for the third offense.
24. Any person who furnished the birthday of an animal to SGBI either on the IPRA or some other document (whereby birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and the animal is exhibited in an SGBI-approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age on the registration certificate by more than 30 days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in a SGBI-approved show for 6 months for the first offense, one year for the second offense and life for the third offense. The animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and shown again.
25. At all National Open Shows and at any other show determined by the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of SGBI, all animals shall be weighed and their weights and weight per day of age made known to judge and show officials. It shall be accomplished by the show officials and/or representatives of SGBI.
26. Each exhibitor shall submit his cattle to such tests and examinations as requested and/or required by SGBI, its authorized representatives, or authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair.
27. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgment past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or exam and the resulting decision.
28. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by Rules of the Association.
29. **Appeals:** An appeal from the decision of the veterinarian or Association representative designated under sections 1 and 4 of the Inspection of Exhibits may be made to the Executive Committee of SGBI if the following requirements are satisfied: (a) The appeal is in writing and is signed by the appealing party; (b) The appeal

pealing party files the written appeal with SGBI Board of Directors or SGBI Representative or fair officials as soon as possible after the veterinarian's or designated Association representatives' decision is rendered and in any event within six (6) hours of the time of the veterinarian's or designated Association representatives' decision was made. If an appeal satisfying the foregoing requirements is filed with the SGBI Board of Directors, the Board of Directors shall hold a hearing at which the appealing party and the veterinarian or designated association representative whose decision is being appealed shall present statements and other evidence that is relevant to the matter, following which the Board of Directors shall render a decision which shall be final and conclusive.

30. **Procedures to file protest:** File protest with the Livestock Office (see General Rules and Regulations). File the same protest with the Shows and Exhibits. Contact the chairman. Three exhibitors must sign the protest. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100 cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and be delivered to the Shows and Exhibits Committee within 24 hours after the occasion for protests. SGBI's order of hearing a protest: 1) Chairman of Shows and Exhibits Committee; 2) Action by Shows and Exhibits Committee; 3) Final action by Board of Directors; 4) Follow appeal procedure as outlined in Rules and Regulations. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested shall be subject to the following penalties: (a) loss of premium money; (b) loss of awards; (c) suspension from showing the animal as deemed necessary; (d) suspension of the exhibitor being the same as other SGBI Rules penalties.

31. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to the above penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.

32. **DISQUALIFICATIONS:** An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation and, depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge(s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor prize money that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or prize money, the animals placing below may be moved up to fill the vacated position.
